Client Casework: Providing Emergency Assistance

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Media Relations for Disaster Workers

Disaster Assessment Basics

This course is designed for local volunteers to provide a brief overview of the concepts of Disaster Assessment with the primary emphasis focused on how to conduct the disaster assessment collection methods and enable local chapter volunteers to be better prepared to assist in initiating the chapter's disaster assessment activities.

Logistics : An Overview & Simulation

This course gives an overview of the Material Support Services group and the activities associated with it.

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Disaster Frontline Supervisor/Simulation

The purpose of this course is to prepare supervisors to lead a team of disaster workers to deliver high quality client service and to create a climate that promotes worker satisfaction.

Prerequisite: Must be DSHR and have the training and experience equivalent to a Service Associate in an activity in which you expect to become a supervisor.

CAS Chapter Disaster Operations

This is a hands-on training in the Client Assistance System (CAS). CAS is the web-based database used to track, monitor & report all assistance provided to our clients at both the chapter & national levels. Knowledge of CAS is required for anyone deploying as a caseworker, health services worker or mental health service worker. It is required of anyone working as a caseworker at the chapter level & strongly recommended for chapter health service & health mental service workers.

Prerequisite: 3-module on-line CAS classes: CAS 3.2 Basics, CAS 3.2 Create a Client Case, CAS Needs & Assistance 2.1.8 (bring certificates). Strongly recommended that students have taken Client Casework: Providing Emergency Assistance or be signed up for the next offering of that class.

Mass Care II (2 Day Course)

This course is to prepare employees and volunteers of the Red Cross to establish, operate and phase out Mass Care services on multi-chapter or national disaster relief operations so that client needs are met in a timely and cost-effective manner.

Prerequisites: Shelter Operations, Disaster Frontline Supervisor/Simulation, experience equivalent to a supervisor in the Mass Care group on a disaster relief operation. Form 5898H is required.

Disaster Instructor Specialty Training (2 Day Course)

This course prepares knowledgeable and experienced disaster services workers to teach basic level disaster training courses.

Prerequisites: Fulfilling Our Mission, Mass Care Overview, Fundamentals of Instruction & Facilitation (self-study), completion of at least three other basic level disaster training courses, DRO experience. Form 5898H is required

Community Disaster Education (CDE) Workshop

The purpose of this workshop is prepare you to delivery disaster preparedness presentations to the public. It does not teach presentation skills; rather, it focuses on how to choose appropriate messages for target audiences and selecting materials that convey those messages.

Fundamentals of Chapter Disaster Operations Management

The purpose of this training is to prepare Red Cross leadership to manage a chapter-administered disaster relief operation.

Prerequisite: Client Casework: Providing Emergency Assistance, Mass Care Overview, Fundamentals of Disaster Assessment (online component), Financial & Statistical Information, Collaborating to Ensure Effective Service Delivery. Form 5898H is required
